1. ACADEMIC AWARDS CRITERIA

Top Achiever per Subject – awarded to the child that receives the highest mark in each subject in each grade based on the combined average for Term 1, Term 2, Term 3 and Term 4.

Top Achiever per Grade – awarded to the child with the highest average in each grade based on the average of **nine** subjects (Grade 7-9) and **seven** subjects (Grade 10-12)

Full Colours is awarded at the end of the academic year from Grade 9-12 and entitles the recipient to display the achievement in the form of an '**ACADEMIC**' **scroll**. The award is based on the combined average for Terms 1 to 4..

4. HONOURS AWARD

An **Honours Award** is the highest achievement that can be attained by a pupil at St Francis College. To be eligible for the **Honours Award** a pupil must have been awarded **Colours 3 (three) times** in a minimum of **2 (two) areas.** One of the Colours must be in the area of **Academics**, leaving the other two Colours Awards to be attained in the areas of sport or culture or academics. Once Honours has been awarded, the pupil may wear the **navy blue Honours Blazer**.
